WEEKLY MASSES/READING TIME/MENTORING/PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

We will continue to have weekly Masses for all grades. Our 7-12 grade masses will continue to be held at 8:05 A.M. on Thursday mornings with our new chaplain, Fr. George Komo. On Tuesdays, we will continue to follow a schedule that includes 05D time for independent reading time. The goal of this reading time is that our students will do some reading for enjoyment. All teachers and administrators will also be using this time for reading. Our professional development this year for all of our teachers grades K-12 will be further work on Authentic Instruction and Assessment (AIW). This year we will be working on the instruction piece of teachers observing other teachers in the classroom. We will be continuing with the Math Cadre program for the second year for the junior/senior high school with Betty Foxhoven, Robinson Luke and Ruth Lewis participating in the program. The elementary and high school leadership teams will continue to participate in meetings being held on the Iowa Core program which we will begin implementing this school year. Again this year, as in the past we will begin each school day with prayer over the intercom followed by class prayers each period of the day.

STATE OF IOWA AND NCEA ACCREDITATION

In February, St. Albert Catholic Schools (Grades PreK-12) will be participating in the State of Iowa and NCEA Accreditation process. The entire administration, faculty and staff will be participating in this accreditation process and preparing for it during the fall and winter of 2010-2011. Parents and students will also be involved in the accreditation process.

MAGAZINES

This year's magazine sales will run from August 20 through September 15. Turn in days for magazines will be on Wednesdays on August 25, September 1, September 8, and September 15. Please continue to help us by renewing your subscriptions through our school. You will benefit by receiving magazines at low prices, and St. Albert will receive 40% of the total sales. The money earned from magazines was used previously to help purchase three portable wireless carts with 24 laptop computers on each cart for use in the classrooms. Also, each teacher received a laptop computer for their classroom use. All of these technology improvements would not have been possible without your help in buying and selling magazines.

ST. ALBERT PRIDE DAYS

Again this school year we will have our St. Albert Pride Days on Fridays. On these days, students in grades 7-12 can wear their St. Albert Pride shirts and khaki cargo/corduroy pants or they may wear Bermuda dress shorts in navy blue or khaki on Fridays only. The dress shorts may be worn on Fridays only with a St. Albert Pride Shirt from the beginning of school until the last day of October and from April 1 until the end of the school year. Pride shirts may be ordered at registration and during lunch periods the first two weeks of school. The shirts are available in dark green or gold with long or short sleeves. At this time, we do not have the cost of the pride day shirts.

UNIFORM REMINDERS

- * Shoes may be open on the back but must be closed toed on the front for high school only. Junior high students must have closed backs and closed toed shoes. Dress shoes must be a solid brown or black dress shoe. Uggs (boots) can only be worn with pants/slacks and must be worn inside the pants/slacks. They cannot be worn over the pants/slacks.
- * Belts must have a buckle and be a solid color – black, navy blue or brown.
- * Sweaters may not have a hood on them or any trim. Sweaters may not be tied around the waist when worn. Colors that are allowed are hunter green, red, navy, and gray for the high school. Junior high students are allowed to wear navy blue sweaters.
- * Slacks and pants may not have any outside seams on them and must be considered a dress slack or pants. Flaps and/or buttons on the back of the slacks and pants will be allowed. Top stitching on the side pant seams will also be allowed.
- * Corduroy/cargo pants (khaki, navy, black or gray) and Bermuda shorts (navy or khaki) are only allowed on Pride Days with the Pride Day Shirt (Fridays). The shorts may be worn from the beginning of school until the last day of October and again from the first of April until the end of the school year.
- * No leggings will be allowed to be worn during the school day.
- * Hair must be neatly groomed – no Mohawks, dreadlocks, etc. Administration has the right to decide on proper hair length. No hair length is allowed where a student’s hair is hanging in a student’s eyes.
- * No scarves or wide bandanas will be allowed to be worn during the normal school day.
- * Skirts/skorts may not be rolled up. If a student is caught with a rolled up skirt/skort, it will result in a dress code violation, and they will receive a demerit. Skirt/skort length is to be no shorter than 2 inches above the top of the knee cap in the front and the back. Please check this on your daughters before they start the school year and be sure that the length is correct.
- * Only the approved St. Albert sweatshirt may be worn during regular school hours-no other sweatshirt will be allowed to be worn.
- * St. Albert fleece jackets that are purchased through Dennis Uniform may be worn as part of the uniform. The colors that are allowed are black, navy, and forest green.
- * T-shirts and turtle necks must be short sleeved with no writing and no print on them and only in the color white.
- * No visible tattoos
- * Only pierced ears may have earrings in them. No tongue rings or nose rings are allowed.

ABSENCES

Just a note to let parents know that excused absences are still counted against a student for the ruling of failing a class due to 15 days of missing a class per semester. The only way that absences (excused) are taken off of this count is through a doctor’s / dentist’s excuse. Please be aware that if your child is missing a lot of days due to an injury or sickness, it is important that you provide the school with a note from the doctor to excuse your child for these absences.

7TH GRADE ORIENTATION/DANCE

All 7th grade students are invited to attend an orientation night on Wednesday, August 11, at 6 P.M. They will visit all of their classes and meet their new teachers, as well as practice opening their lockers. After the orientation, all junior high students are invited to a dance in the small gym or cafeteria (depending on the weather that day). The dance will run from 7:30 P.M. until 9 P.M. A disc jockey will provide the music for the dance. Pizza and pop will be included in the \$6 admission fee.

NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION

The high school student council will be hosting a new student orientation for all students in grades 9-12 on Tuesday, August 10, at 10 A.M. All new students will be receiving a letter of invitation to this orientation in the near future.

VISITORS/GUESTS

This year the following criteria will again be followed for visitors and guests in the building during school hours.

- * Students/parents may request permission to bring visitors who have a clear interest in transferring to St. Albert. (Approval must be obtained at least twenty-four hours in advance of the visit.) Permission will be granted for visiting students in grades seven through eleven. Students should not ask to bring friends attending other schools unless there is a stated intent to transfer to St. Albert. Visitors will not be granted permission to visit during semester exams. Any exceptions to this rule must be okayed by the principal.
- * Visitors to the school grounds must check in at the main office. We believe that the need for student visitors from outside the St. Albert school district is not necessary during the school day. Students who are interested in enrolling at St. Albert must obtain a visitor's pass and meet with the guidance counselor. (Approval must be obtained at least twenty-four hours in advance of the visit.) Visitor identification badges provided should be on display at all times while in the building or on the school grounds after check-in.
- * No visitors or guests are allowed in the cafeteria or in classrooms during school hours. Lunches for students may be dropped off in the high school office. Parents and siblings who wish to eat with their child/brother/sister must obtain a pass from the high school office and are only allowed to be in the cafeteria area.
- * All visitors to the building must enter through the main entrance where they will be allowed to come in after they tell what business they have in the building. All visitors must immediately come to the main office and receive a visitor's pass which they must display while they are in the building.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

On Friday, September 17, students will be dismissed at 11:30 A.M. because the faculty will be receiving training on AIW in the area of instruction.

CELL PHONES

Just a reminder: Any student who has his phone taken away by a teacher for having it out during school hours will receive an automatic detention and will be able to pick their phone up in the office after the first offense. The second offense and any thereafter will result in another automatic detention and only the student's parents/legal guardian being able to pick up the phone in the school office.

On Monday, September 13, various Catholic Colleges will be at St. Albert to visit with our 10th and 11th grade students and any interested 12th grade students.
